Mail Summary and Letter Excerpts

MAIL SUMMARY

3/2/72

The total income for the year through February showed a 12.9% increase over last year. The total mail count for the first two months is about a minus 9 percent compared to 1971, while the white mail is down only slightly.

The year 1971 ended with a total letter count of 2,484,200 — somewhat lower than the figure for 1970. But we had a 32 percent increase in white mail for the year, which represents quite an increase in our mailing list since most of these people wrote in for the first time. And receipts on the last day of the year brought the income just up to the percentage of increase anticipated for 1971!

Statements of intention continue to come in slowly. So far 13,847 cards have been returned — 48.9 percent of the number sent out — for a total of \$149,142.14 per month. Of course, a minimum of \$200,000 per month is needed to follow through on payments for the House for God. So continue to exhort the brethren to send in their Statement of Intention Cards.

We have been receiving quite a number of letters from people who miss the daily broadcast. They are also commenting positively on Mr. Herbert Armstrong's broadcasts — many are happy to hear him again.

Responses to the telecast over WOR-TV (New York) are very good. The first telecast, "What Deserts Need", drew 786 first time responses. The same program on KTLA-TV (Los Angeles) drew 838 when it was played last June. The second telecast on "Animal Oddities" drew over 3,700 responses.

An interesting sidelight: On February 8, the child rearing booklet was recommended to readers of the "Mrs. Griggs" column in the Milwaukee-Journal. As a result 275 people have written for the booklet.

Please note that many of the brethren are sending in their tithes without their complete name and address on the envelope. If they would include this information it certainly would greatly speed up processing of their contributions. Many also seem to be careless in marking the break-down of their tithes and offerings—such as the first, second, third tithes, building fund, etc. Some are marking "second" when they really mean "third". They need to realize that it's important to clearly indicate each category and how much belongs to each. We would appreciate your help in this matter by bringing this to the attention of the brethren.

LETTER EXCERPTS

Responses to Mr. Herbert W. Armstrong's broadcasts and the lack of daily programs continue to come in. So far we have received around 1,000 letters — 300 of which are responses to Mr. Armstrong's broadcasts. Literature responses to his broadcasts are also very good. For example:

Dear Fellow Ministers:

GREETINGS to you all again from the Office of Financial Affairs! It seems a long time since my last letter to you, but I know that you have been kept informed of any major news, both at the Ministerial Conference and through the district conferences that were later conducted in your districts.

The financial situation right now is not really good. We do, of course, expect a slight condition of reverse cash flow at the present time of the year, which seems to be seasonal, but you might be interested in knowing that we are presently running about two and a half million dollars in deficit. This means that we have had to dip into our reserves by that amount. However, this is not an unusual situation for this time of the year, and the projections for March and April, especially when the Holy Day offerings are taken into consideration, are quite positive.

At present our year-to-date income is running about five percent behind our budget. As also mentioned during the Conference, we are structuring the 1972 budget at a 17.4 percent increase over 1971. Of course, every time we miss the budget figure, we have to show a bigger increase the following month to make up the deficit. However, I am not pessimistic at all at the present time, and even though we have had to put a temporary "freeze" on hiring and equipment acquisitions, I feel that by the end of April we should have worked ourselves into a good financial situation again.

There are a number of construction projects which have been tearing up the whole campus over the last several weeks, not the least of which is the preparations in full swing for the House for God! The workmen are presently busily pouring concrete foundations for a building that will soon rise seventy feet in the air and dominate this end of Pasadena.

I also talked with Mr. Elliott this morning concerning the new parking structure and athletic field which needs to be built this coming summer in order to be in use for the 1972-1973 school year. Mr. Elliott feels that this structure can be built in three to four months, and I know that it will add a great dimension to student life to have such a fine facility available to them.

If you add to the present construction the fact that the freeway is beginning to make its presence felt through the campus, you can imagine that there is quite a lot of noise and dust which may be

with us for perhaps a year or so. The end results, however, are more than worth looking forward to!

I should mention at this stage that the construction of buildings on the campus has to be a very carefully planned procedure because there is so much involved in putting up what some people might consider to be a "simple building". We have to take into account such things as high income periods of the year, labor availability, materials availability, parking constraints, accessibility to the construction site, etc., etc., all of which combined can bring a few headaches! I am happy to say, though, that with Mr. Elliott's cooperation and that of those working with him, we are able to pursue a very imaginative building program. There may be dirt and noise for a little time, but the outcome will be highly profitable for the Work!

I know that all of you will be very enthusiastic to hear that Mr. Armstrong is well and truly back "in the saddle" in making the radio broadcast! As a matter of fact, I was just watching him make a program this morning, and I believe that the inspired, dynamic and powerful approach he can bring to the World Tomorrow program will be very effective in bringing new readers to the Plain Truth, and ultimately to Church membership. He has made three programs already this week (This is Thursday.), and is really feeling encouraged and enthusiastic about his ability to do more. I know that he does appreciate very greatly all our prayers for his inspiration and strength in what could become a very tiring and taxing schedule.

The May and June editions of the Plain Truth are now being put together, and it is planned that we will be covering articles on China and Northern Ireland, as well as more scriptural articles on human mind and the power of Satan in the world today. The combining of the Plain Truth and Tomorrow's World is another area that I feel very encouraged and enthusiastic about because I know that taking a more scriptural approach to some of the articles in the Plain Truth is going to bring about a quicker commitment on the part of the reader and a stronger desire to look further into God's Word in seeking answers to those problems that are plaguing people living in this "present evil world". The full impact, of course, of this approach will not be felt for perhaps three to six months, but I know that God has inspired Mr. Armstrong to make these changes and the results can be nothing but good.

Some of you may have heard that Mr. Armstrong recently paid a visit to our campus in Big Sandy, and has tentatively approved the construction of a four or five storey administration building on the campus there. This will enable all of the administrative staff of the College and Church to be together in one area, resulting in much greater efficiency and communications. I understand from Mr. McCullough that he is presently working with architects on conceptual renderings, costs, land use, etc. All these drawings and ideas, of course, will be very preliminary, and subject to approval by Mr. Armstrong. Mr. McCullough is hoping that they can break ground by

June and have the building completed within nine months to a year. Needless to say, he is very excited and enthusiastic about this project.

He also mentioned that they are busily preparing the application forms and details for the Feast of Tabernacles this year, and they should all be in the mail to the membership by Passover. This should give ample time for everyone to make arrangements and plan ahead for this Fall festival.

This year we are planning on opening two new feast sites. One feast site, of course, is the one presently under construction in the Wisconsin Dells, which should be complete, with certain exceptions concerning paving of the parking lots, by the time of the Feast. We are planning on sending ten thousand people to the Dells this year. Also, in order to relieve the pressure on Mt. Pocono and the Ozarks, we have contracted to take the Convention Center in Alexandria, Louisiana, for 7,500 people. This will be just a temporary move and may be done this year only, but will enable us to get the feel of using pre-built convention sites, and any of the attendant problems. He also mentioned that we are planning on reducing the number of people attending in Squaw Valley, as well as the Poconos and Ozarks, although exact figures have not yet been decided. He did say, however, that there would be 14,000 again attending in Big Sandy, 10,000 of whom will be camping right there at the Feast site.

As you can gather, a lot of things are happening, and there is a great deal of pressure on all of us here at Headquarters. We surely do appreciate all your prayers and concern for us. God's Work is really taking some gigantic steps forward, and we will need to be together in unity and dedication to the commission that God has given to us. We at Headquarters really appreciate all the efforts of you men who are "in the field", and know that we can count on you to represent God's Work and God's Way to all those He is calling at this time.

Please remember us all in your prayers!

Dear Fellow Ministers:

Greetings again from Pasadena! Sorry to have been so long getting out the Bulletin this time, but with the recent traumas and important changes in the Work, I am sure you all understand. We hope it will come out regularly from now on. It was good to see many of you again recently at the special District Conferences. All of us who went out returned inspired and invigorated by your attitudes and the continuing guidance that Jesus Christ is giving His Church in every way.

Mr. Herbert Armstrong is fine and is doing a radio broadcast nearly every day now! In fact, he did two in one day early this week and with his old confidence coming back he hopes to keep the program on most major stations daily, if possible, and get back on TV within the next several months. It is inspiring to see how God is strengthening and inspiring him at this time.

There is a lot of excitement about the new opportunities being opened up through Reader's Digest ads, and also the combining of The PLAIN TRUTH and TOMORROW'S WORLD magazines. The new editorial team has already had a number of meetings -- about five hours of them in just the last two days -- and we feel most confident that God will guide and bless the new approach in The PLAIN TRUTH. I should emphasize that it will not merely be going back to the "old" PLAIN TRUTH of the 1950s, but will retain and hopefully even improve many of the fine innovations which have come about through both The PLAIN TRUTH and TOMORROW'S WORLD during the last few years. Therefore, although the magazine will start out with more news and human interest articles, it will quickly lead into direct Biblical articles of the type which have been appearing in TOMORROW'S WORLD for the last couple of years. And this means, as Mr. Armstrong stated, that nearly THREE TIMES as many people will now be getting more of the complete truth of God through our magazine than ever before in this manner!

The new editorial policy will take effect in May, but the May and June issues may be somewhat transitional so as not to hit our more secular readers too hard at first. However, by July or August we ought to be pretty well hitting full stride with the kind of balanced -- yet heavily spiritual and Biblical -- approach which has been outlined. Be sure to encourage and inspire your people to ask God's guidance and blessing in this new approach -- and in the fantastic opportunity to reach over 35 MILLION people through Reader's Digest ads!

By way of further news, let me say that a number of us are coming out from the Pasadena and Big Sandy campuses to join you during the Days of Unleavened Bread. As some of these plans are still being firmed up while I write, I will just ask you to see the listing following my letter giving these news items in brief form.

I hope the instruction "packet" on Functions of Church Pastors -plus material covered in our recent Ministerial Conference -- begin to give
you the specific ideas of what we mean by more opportunities and responsibilities in the Field ministry. Be sure to read and study this material carefully -- and APPLY these instructions immediately! You will definitely find
they give the local pastors -- as well as the District Superintendents -- more
responsibilities and challenge than ever before.

Be responsive and positive in following this new approach. Then, this summer, we will be consulting you and the Superintendents about any further suggestions you would like to make regarding improvements or "updates" in this program. We want to keep on improving our efficiency and service to God's people! But zealously follow the new instructions now. Give them real enthusiastic application in your area and THEN, later on, you will be in a better position to give us objective help and criticism in improving them even further.

The two new church districts that we talked about have now become reality! Mr. Paul Flatt is now Superintendent over the New Orleans district -- comprising the New Orleans and Baton Rouge Church circuits, with Mobile and Geneva, Ala.; Jackson, Miss. and Monroe, La.; and Lake Charles and Alexandria, La.

Mr. Walter Sharp is now Superintendent over the Cincinnati district. It comprises the following church circuits: Cincinnati West with Portsmouth, Ohio; Cincinnati East with Covington, Ky.; Dayton AM and PM; Indianapolis and Lafayette, Ind.; Lexington and Louisville, Ky.; and Charleston and Parkersburg, W. Va.

Other inspiring news is that a number of ordinations were approved during the Ministerial Conference and were carried out either there or soon after in the local areas. We will list all of these just following my letter. But please accept our congratulations, men, for overcoming and allowing God to use you for these fine offices of service! And I think it not inappropriate to give special congratulations to Mr. Cecil Battles. He has served long, faithfully and well in Christ's field ministry and has now been ordained to Pastor rank in God's Church!

Three other ministerial assistants, not mentioned in the Last Bulletin, are being sent out. Two are seniors from Big Sandy who will go out for a year and then return to finish their last year of college. Briscoe Ellett was sent to assist Bill Swanson in Chattanooga; and Bill Nelson to Wichita Falls, Tex.,

to assist Mark Salyer. The third man is a graduate of our Bricket Wood campus, but an American from Oakland, Calif. who has been transferred from England to assist Terry Swaggerty in Boise. His name is Steve Fallaw.

By way of INSTRUCTION: It has been decided -- after reviewing it with Mr. Herbert Armstrong even after the conference -- that full-time ministerial assistants will NOT have to save second or third tithe. This ruling has really been gone over, so I am sure that it is fast and sure this time! Also, although "local" Local Elders [those not employed by the Work] should save second tithe for the Feast since they have their own income, they do NOT need to save third tithe as they are recipients of third tithe when necessary as spiritual Levites -- and a number of these men definitely give enough of themselves in using their cars, homes, time and energies in visiting, anointing and serving God's people that they more than make up for what this would amount to anyway. Therefore, we feel it best not to impose third tithe responsibilities on them -- as some with good-sized families and average incomes run very close financially as it is.

I am sure these latest guidelines are fair and equitable and hope all of you pastors will get this information to your local elders and assistants as soon as possible and perhaps explain the reason behind this decision as I have here. If any of the men involved have already saved quite a bit of either second or third tithe, I would leave it pretty well up to their discretion and need as to what they do with it. Perhaps some -- in tight financial circumstances -- may wish to keep it to support their family or pay off a huge college debt. Others may wish to use it for the Feast or simply turn it into an extra offering at that time, or sooner.

More important INSTRUCTIONS: We solicit your <u>zealous cooperation</u> in helping us keep track of and handle the increasing criticism, attacks, persecutions and slurs against this Work both from the inside and outside of God's Church. This is a VITAL matter! Communication is an art all of us have difficulty mastering. We here at Headquarters have a hard time keeping up with what is going on in the Field -- much less trying to get the latest to you about every incident regarding the above. BUT, we will do our best to let you know about anything of import, and hope you will become aware of the real need Christ's Headquarters has of enthusiastic and active communication from you!

The more we are attacked and criticized by this world, disfellow-shipped members, and even in some cases those who call themselves members, the more we need the news clippings, comments, radio talk show information relating to us, even gossip (right or wrong in factual content) passed on to us here at Headquarters so we will be equipped to defuse or defend against those attacks.

David Jon Hill has been put in charge of gathering and cataloging as well as analyzing and recommending action on all such criticism and attacks

on the Work. Therefore, everything from criticism of our literature to gossip about the announcement regarding Garner Ted Armstrong should be immediately sent to his attention. As usual, you may send it in through your regular ministerial report envelope -- but with the item marked: "Attention Mr. Hill."

However, if time is of essence, you may wish to write in between times <u>directly</u> to him or even CALL HIM if you feel the problem definitely warrants immediate high-level attention from here. Mr. Hill, Mr. Portune, I, and others will work closely on this matter, but Mr. Hill is the man to develop the skill, the team and the tools to handle this type of problem.

One of the common misconceptions in the Field is, "Well, Head-quarters probably already knows about this!" and so Headquarters never finds out. So send whatever you have. Duplications will be welcome -- it is much better to have 20 copies of something than none at all! Think about this problem and discuss it with your local elders and assistants so they can also impart to you what maybe needs to come here to Headquarters for our attention. And then send it in quickly.

Back to happier matters, we have another <u>new program</u>! From now on, all of our Choirs in the United States will be coordinated through C.A.D. This will be done under a guiding committee consisting of Mr. Portune, myself, Mr. Luker and Mr. Gary Prather. We will work through John D. Schroeder, conductor of our Headquarters Church Choir. As our agent, John will work directly with our Church Choir conductors and the ministers who oversee their work.

John will begin by mailing a questionnaire to all our Church Pastors. He will also request a color photograph of each group in their choir outfits with its accompanist and conductor -- so please prepare to return the questionnaire with the photographs as quickly as possible. We have a lot of exciting ideas and want to implement them as soon as possible -- but we need to know your needs before we can really get this new program off the ground.

Thanks for your cooperation!

Now I would like to REMIND all of you pastors of churches about the responsibility of checking closely ALL recommendations for ordination and sending them through your District Superintendent. You should take plenty of time to thoroughly check and to prove any men to be ordained. The local ministers who know the man should have the basic responsibility to fast and pray about these ordinations before forwarding any recommendations.

And all recommendations and evaluations regarding ordination should be sent to us at least THREE weeks before ordination date! This is so we will have ample opportunity to check with Mr. Herbert Armstrong

and get his approval. And with his busy schedule, as you are all aware, we can't meet with him just any day your recommendation happens to come in -- especially when he may be out of the nation for weeks at a time on occasion. Therefore, most of you local pastors should plan to forward your recommendations to your District Superintendent about SIX WEEKS in advance of ordination date, and the superintendents should try to forward it to us a full month in advance, if possible.

So you can see by the above that any recommendations still not in now -- as you read this letter -- cannot be approved for this Passover, 1972. They will simply have to be delayed until Pentecost which is happily only seven weeks later! But be sure to follow the above reminder in your practice or some ordinations may have to be delayed all the way from Pentecost to the Feast of Tabernacles -- which might often be discouraging as well as unnecessary.

We have also noticed that there has been a PROBLEM in a few cases of members not getting The GOOD NEWS magazine after baptism. We know there is a normal processing period before they are added to the list, but there have been delays that can and should be corrected.

In order to help correct the situation, we would like to ask you to follow these instructions. Be sure to fill out Baptism Cards immediately after baptizing a person and send it in to Headquarters in your next weekly report. Some men apparently have not been doing this promptly and, in some cases, only after months of delay will finally send the cards to us. Remember that a new member is not listed as a member until you tell us that they have become a member.

In addition, they will not begin receiving The GOOD NEWS magazine until we receive their Baptism Card from you. The reason for this procedure is that many people consider themselves members merely by listening to the broadcast, subscribing to The PLAIN TRUTH magazine or sending a few dollars during the year. Occasionally some of them write in for The GOOD NEWS if they find out about it, when they aren't actually baptized members. This is one reason why we must wait for you to send us the Baptism Card.

Since in some cases we had not been notified of a person's baptism, members have been forced to write in by themselves for The GOOD NEWS magazine. Even then we cannot send it to them until we get the Baptism Card because the minister alone knows whether they have been baptized.

One other factor brought to our attention by these "members" writing in for The GOOD NEWS is the <u>long</u> period of time that has elapsed from baptism until they actually wrote in for the magazine. In one case a lady wrote concerning the fact that she had not received The GOOD NEWS for over <u>TWO YEARS!</u> Therefore, please inform the new members not to wait for such a long time before writing inquiries to Headquarters regarding the whereabouts

of their GOOD NEWS. If these two procedures could be followed, we feel this would certainly cut down on the delays some members have had in getting their GOOD NEWS, member letters, etc., from Headquarters.

Finally, let me say that all of the Evangelists and Executive Team here at Headquarters are working very closely with Mr. Armstrong and are truly inspired and appreciative of the way Christ is guiding us all and blessing the Work at this time. It is a real pleasure to work with Mr. Portune, and the entire "team" of Evangelists feels much closer together than we have in many, many years.

So we have <u>much</u> to be thankful for, but we still need to pray FER-VENTLY for the Work, for Mr. Armstrong, Mr. Portune and for one another all over this globe! Certainly, Satan the devil will try to strike at us harder than ever as the end of this age approaches -- and especially, as usual, at this Passover season.

I would like to suggest to every one of you to set aside at least one day for both fasting and prayer between now and the Passover. Ask for Christ's guidance, blessing and protection for His Church -- and all of us in it. Ask Him to help, guide and deliver Mr. Garner Ted Armstrong. And ask Him to help us all to be properly humbled, sobered and yielded to our God.

In a greatly magnified and truly <u>spiritual</u> manner, let us follow the fine example King Hezekiah of Judah set in his day for <u>all</u> servants of God of all time: "And in every work that he began in the service of the house of God and we are building a house for God!, and in the law, and in the commandments to SEEK his God, he did it with ALL HIS HEART, and <u>prospered</u>" (II Chron. 31:21).

It is obvious that Christ is humbling us, trying us and helping us to "gear up" for a far greater work than we have done before. So let us truly SEEK our God. And know that we will have His guidance, inspiration and POWER -- including an even greater outpouring of spiritual gifts and healings -- than ever before. I know we all want this in our hearts and perhaps have for many years. But now it is time to earnestly seek for this help and guidance with a humble and consistent fervency that will bring God's certain answer.

COLD WEATHER DRIVING PRECAUTIONS

Even though winter is nearly over, this is still a very rough time of the year for many of our fleet drivers working in the northern areas of the United States. They face additional road hazards such as ice, snow, blizzards and cold.

Have you ever considered what would happen if your car broke down or you became stranded during a storm and had to spend the night in a snowbank? We would like to make some suggestions as to the kind of equipment to carry with you, and the PRECAUTIONS you should take to prepare yourself for such an emergency. Since these are only suggestions, you can tailor your "emergency kit" to suit your own individual needs.

During the winter months, especially, you should try to keep the fuel tank as full as possible in order to cut down on the chance of condensation inside the tank. This will also give you extra weight for added traction on ice and in snow.

Keep a set of tire chains and a shovel in your trunk.

Have a supply of four or five flares (they can be purchased at most auto supply stores).

As at all other times during the year, keep your car in top mechanical condition.

Keep some extra warm clothing in your trunk in addition to the clothes you normally wear. They should include special over-coats, mittens, "ear flapper" caps and perhaps insulated underwear and boots.

Heavy blankets or sleeping bags are a must!

Several years ago one of our ministers was stranded in a blizzard after being rear-ended by a truck. It is very likely that the sleeping bag he carried in his car saved his life!

Enough dried fruit, canned goods, candy bars and drinking water for a couple of days may also serve to make your situation more tolerable — if and when such an emergency arises.

It is not advisable to use a catalytic heater, gas heater, charcoal burner or any other opentype fire in a closed vehicle. This will only use up the oxygen and you could die in your sleep. In fact, two Ambassador College students had this very experience just this year. They are dead now!

Of course, the usual precaution against going to sleep with the engine running should also be followed in order to prevent carbon monoxide poisoning.

The sad part about it is that after scheduling a seven-week tour - about as long as the men could afford to be away from their families they still will have been unable to meet all the people requesting a visit. For that reason, we're probably going to schedule another baptizing tour immediately after the students finish on the dig this summer.

One unknown factor our men are facing is illustrated by the following letter:

Respected Dear Editor,

A thousand greetings in Jesus name. I'm a Gen. Secretary of the Church of God (Sabbatarian) in Mizo Hills which is situated in the north eastern most part of India. We are nearly 500 backwarded tribal people scattering in more than 10 villages. We bear the name Church of God since 1968. Before that we were Church of Israel observing the 7th. day Sabbath and other feasts. We know that there are many organisations of the Church of God (7th. Day) abroad. But you mentioned in the Tomorrow's World that yours is the only True One. Being an independent organisation we are anxious about this matter as we, with a view to the advancement of the Gospel work, have a mind to join any group of Church of God in the States presently. Please rush to lead/guide us in this problem and fail not to explain and arrange how to be One with the TRUE CHURCH.

The name of this church (Church of Israel) is interesting since the name of the church we encountered in Argentina was "The Israelite Church of the New Covenant." We are not at all sure that these churches grew directly out of the Stanberry, Missouri Church of God or the Oregon Conference of that church. Some of the 7th Day Church of God congregations we have encountered have a tradition tracing them back to what we have come to call the Sardis era of God's church. The "missionary" who originally came into their area was listed among the ministers of the Stanberry Church of God. However. there is no connection between the Argentina churches and the Stanberry group.

It's also interesting to note that these people keep "other Feasts." The churches of God in Argentina do keep all of the annual Holy Days - although some of them are kept on the wrong date. I suspect we're going to find that the "Church of Israel" in India is also observing the Holy Days.

At any rate, Mr. Frankel is going to try to meet as many of them as possible and see what can be done to help them. Unfortunately, the letter quoted above comes from an area where travel is not safe at the present time. So Mr. Frankel and Mr. Carpenter may not go in there on this trip.

Please remember them earnestly in your prayers as this trip is not going to be accomplished without difficulties.

REPORT ON LETTER TO RHODESIAN SUBSCRIBERS

What kind of an effect can a routine letter have? The results of a letter sent recently by Mr. Fahey to our 13,000 Rhodesian Plain Truth subscribers illustrates that the effect can be startling!

Mr. Fahey was writing basically to give subscribers our new mail receiving address in Salisbury. But he felt that people would respond better if they knew to whom they would be writing.

Here is the text of the letter:

In an effort to give you, our readers in Rhodesia, better service, we have opened a postal address in Salisbury. We feel he will be able to give a more individual and personal service to those writing to us from Rhodesia. In the future please send all your correspondence to:

You'll notice that the emphasis in the letter is on "individual and personal service." And this engendered an unusually individual and personal response! We have since received hundreds of letters expressing appreciation to Ambassador College for helping Rhodesian subscribers in this way. Hundreds of letters have also been received expressing a personal welcome to Rhodesia to us, and hoping we'll enjoy the climate, have a long and happy stay, etc. Many have been written for no other purpose, and from many Africans who have to think twice before spending the money for a stamp!

At the end of October, when the letter went out, we had a total of 110 PMs. In the ensuing two weeks, we received 22 visit requests — a 20% increase in our number of PM's!

Total Rhodesian mail rose by 50% for several weeks running — from the normal 700 to over 1,000 a week! Included were many first-time donations.

It all emphasizes again the fact that people are hungry for a feeling of personal contact with the Work. Now we have to live up to the promise of the letter. But the figures so far show this will be more than worthwhile!
